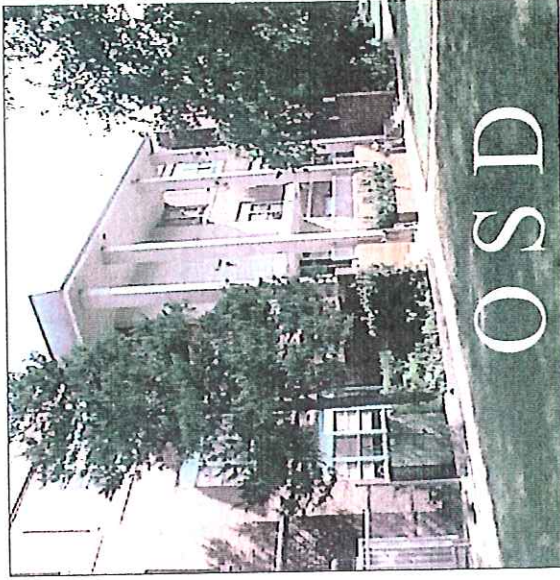

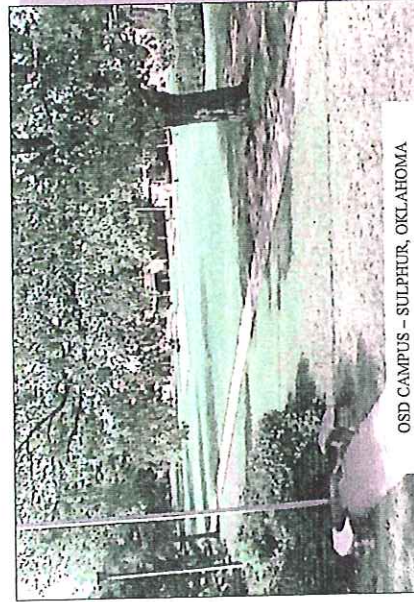

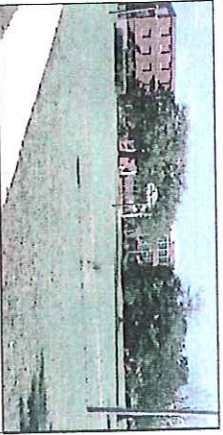

Educational Needs of Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students

The unique language and communication needs of students who are deaf and hard of hearing often pose challenges for schools striving to provide appropriate educational services in the least restrictive environment.

Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team Summary and Individual Education Plan Development

An OSD Outreach Consultant is Deaf Education certified and is available to serve as a member of the IEP team as well as a member of the MEETS team.

Staff Development

Educational staff in public schools will benefit from preservice and in-service programs which address the needs of students who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Classroom Accessibility

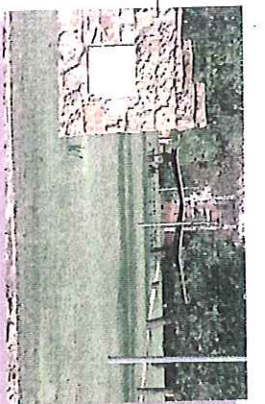
Important considerations for students who are deaf or hard of hearing are classroom modifications, including appropriate technological support and acoustical and visual modifications.

Educational Interpreters

The shortage of qualified interpreters has been indicated nationwide. Assistance with locating interpreters within the State will be provided. In addition, information related to appropriate communication accessibility will be available.
